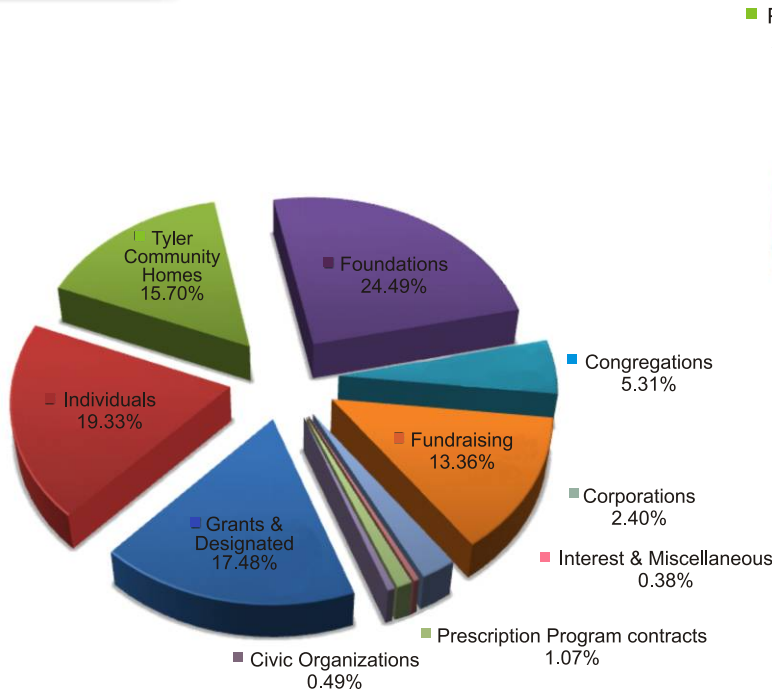
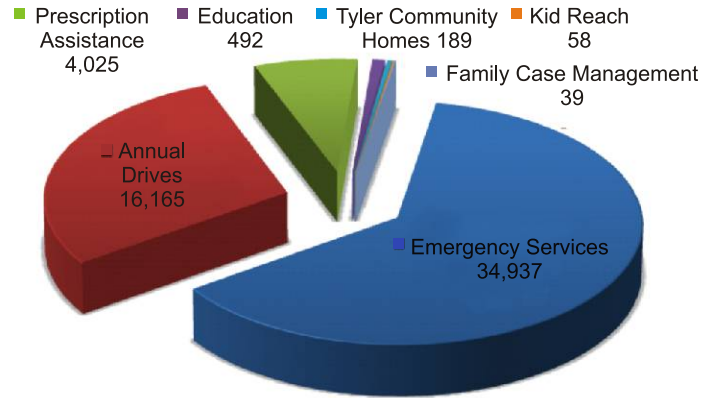




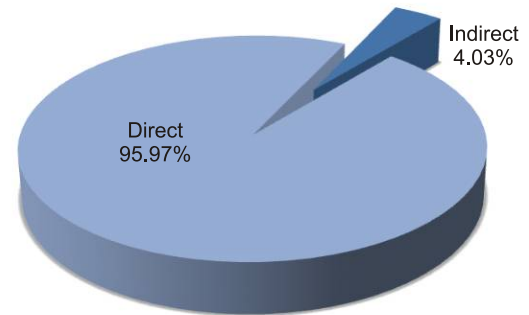

464 volunteers provided support to PATH programs which translates to a value of \$260,568.

PATH's programs fit under the umbrella of Five Steps on the PATH to Success. These five steps are Prevention, Rescue, Stabilization, Growth and Independence.



Step 1 - Prevention

PATH Kid Reach mentoring program has **58** children enrolled in healthy mentoring relationships.

Step 2 - Rescue

With the assistance of **64** volunteers, PATH Emergency Assistance program was able to provide these services:

Our Food Pantry provided nutritious, non-perishable food to **14,592** families.

Thanks to the East Texas Food Bank, we were able to offer fresh produce each Wednesday to an estimated **200** families.

Rental and Mortgage Assistance prevented foreclosures and evictions for **56** families

Utility assistance helped **833** families stay cool in the summer and warm in the winter

Emergency prescriptions met the emergency medical needs and improved the health of **889** people

Eyeglasses were provided to more than **114** people

Emergency dental work was made available to **177** people thanks to local volunteer dentists

Miscellaneous services were provided to **904** people. Those services included help obtaining or retaining employment, drivers licenses, birth certificates, auto repairs and gasoline.

Step 3 - Stabilization

PATH Long-Term Prescription Assistance Program, assisted by **5** volunteers, improved the health of more than **4,025** people with prescription medication valued at more than **\$3.4 million**. This program would not be possible without the Bethesda Clinic and **202** Smith County physicians who partner with the program.

PATH Community Homes provided safe, affordable housing to more than **189** families referred to PATH by partnering agencies including the Salvation Army, East Texas Crisis Center, and Kathryn's House. Several individuals moved into a PATH home directly from the streets.

PATH Special Projects and Drives:

Diapers and formula helped more than **2,750** moms and babies

904 families were kept cooler by fans from PATH's Fan Club drive

School Supply Train provided **101,709** school supply items to **63** Smith County schools

Coats for Kids provided warm winter coats to **2,319** children

Christmas in the Neighborhood made the holidays happy for **117** families

Step 4 - Growth

PATH Education Program helped hundreds of people reach their goals and get further along on their path to self-sufficiency:

87 people participated in Literacy Council of Tyler GED classes held at PATH

23 adults participated in money management classes

266 adults participated in the nutrition classes

54 adults participated in computer skills classes

62 adults participated in various life skills workshops, resume assistance and job placement

Step 5 - Independence

39 families are currently enrolled in the **Family Support & Development Program**. PATH caseworkers work with each family to establish goals that eventually lead them to independence. Heads of households are gaining or improving employment, continuing their education, meeting their family's healthcare needs, and finding better housing and appropriate childcare.
